MARÍA BERRÍO

Born 1982, Bogotá, Colombia Lives and works in New York, NY

María Berrío's large collaged works—comprised of diversely sourced papers, depict surrealist narratives that blur biographical memory with South American mythology. Born and raised in Bogotá, Colombia, Berrío relocated to New York City at eighteen where she received her BFA at Parsons School of Design in 2004, followed by her MFA at the School of Visual Arts in 2007. Her work explores themes such as intercultural connectivity, migration and humankind's relationship to nature. Berrío is included in the permanent collections of the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York, NY; Philadelphia Museum of Art, Philadelphia, PA; Dallas Museum of Art, Dallas, TX; Pérez Art Museum, Miami, FL, Nasher Museum of Art, Durham, NC; Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art, Bentonville, AR; and the Ford Foundation, New York, NY. Her work has been shown both nationally and internationally, participating in exhibitions at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Philadelphia, PA; Nasher Museum of Art, Durham, NC; and El Museo del Barrio, New York, NY, among others. Most recently, Berrío was included in the Prospect 4 Triennial in New Orleans, as well as unveiled her permanent installation commissioned by the MTA Arts and Design program in New York City subway stations.
